
### "Opportunities in our neighborhood"



A few weeks ago a family in our neighborhood decided to approach us and ask if we would be willing to pray with their daughter who was suffering from depression. Though strongly catholic, they knew we were pastors and that their daughter needed help. A few hours later, we went to visit this young lady and the Lord opened an amazing door to share the Gospel with her.

Since her husband left her, this young lady has reared her two children alone. She has been working full-time and caring for her kids around the clock and the realities and the challenges of her life have caused her to ask a lot of great questions. We were overjoyed that we had the opportunity to share with her the hope that she has in Christ and walk her through some initial steps of reordering her life according to the Gospel. Since that initial meeting we have enjoyed seeing her in church and afterwards for Sunday lunch in our homes. She has now asked if we can meet twice a week to talk more about changes she wants to make in her life. We are so thankful to see how the Lord is working in her life, and thankful for the opportunities you, our supporters, give us to do this work!

Our families are missionaries with Mission to the World, the missionary-sending agency of the Presbyterian Church in America, currently serving in Bogotá, Colombia. Next year, we will be moving to a to-be-determined location in South America to beginning a new work with MTW. Find more info at:




We are excited to be partnering with Seattle Drip Coffee again this year for our end of the year annual fundraiser! All proceeds from this year's coffee drive will go towards getting our three families to Peru. If you remember from our previous newsletter we are set to leave on December 11<sup>th</sup> for Peru and there are many unforeseen expenses with this

transition that we need help with.

#### How does it work?

We are selling  $\frac{3}{4}$  pound bags of coffee for \$12 a bag. Roughly half of what is made from each bag sold comes to us. If you are thinking about end of the year gifts for coworkers, family, or your company then have a special offer of 50 bags or more at \$10 a bag. If churches want to promote this as a way of keeping our team before your congregations, we are offering the same deal: 50 bags for \$10 each.
