### **BOOTS ON THE GROUND**

At the end of January, the Gutierrez family returned from their 5-month Home Ministry Assignment ("HMA," previously furlough). This was a muchwelcomed relief for the Bonhams, who had been holding down the fort in AQP. But more than just being an a relief from travel and heightened work-loads, our much-anticipated reunion provided all of us with an opportunity to begin afresh in ministry here in Arequipa. 2016 had felt more like a year of maintenance and survival, since each of our families had needed to take a 4-5 month HMA while the other family handled ministry on the field. After so much time apart, we were excited to get the chance to regroup and start moving forward with newfound momentum.

Our first week back together, we hit the ground running and had a sweet time of catching up and seeking the Lord's guidance for ministry in Arequipa for 2017 and the years to come. ### TAKING STEPS

As you may know, our hope is to see Peruvians pastoring and planting their own churches. We want to be instruments of discipling and training these pastors. Those plans were drastically changed when we arrived in Arequipa and were asked to pastor a local congregation. Of course it was not our original plan, but God has used this experience in a thousand ways. We have learned so much serving this congregation. We have seen

But now it is time to start taking steps to transition from pastoring this congregation. A few weeks ago we had a congregational meeting that is putting us in a trajectory to transition to Peruvian leadership in the church. We had to communicate many challenging things to the congregation, but they received it with humility and a desire to see the church grow with Peruvian leadership. The reality is that each member must take responsibility in their involvement in the church and in their financial giving.

Our hope is to have a Peruvian pastor identified by the end of 2018 and see some Peruvians stepping up to the task of the leadership of the church. We are slowly implementing a strategy to see this happen, but ultimately, it is in the Lord's hands. We cannot change hearts or call people to the ministry. We simply want to be faithful to what the Lord has called us to. Please pray for the Lord to raise up leaders in this church and that we may transition well. This is by far the hardest part of ministry in a foreign culture.


## **PRAYER REQUESTS**
