#### RIVERS OF LIVING WATER

"It's a blessing, not only for my family but also for my neighbors, to be able to share water." As we shared in our last newsletter and you've likely seen on the news, Peru has been slammed with flooding this year due to a "Super El Niño." Of course, the problem is the amount of rain, but also the fact that the infrastructure is not adequate. Therefore, that puts us in a dilemma. No rain means no crops and no water, but



even moderate rain means destruction and water cuts. Yes, you heard that right. When there is rain, water cuts are very typical because they want to prevent inundation of the water systems.



Many members of our church go days and sometimes weeks without running water. During these times, they depend on sporadic arrivals of water trucks in order to fill a bucket or two. This results in long lines and sometimes violent situations as people try to fill a bucket of water to last them for days.

In May, we were blessed with a short-term missions team from Madison Heights Church (Madison, MS) to help us install water tanks for a handful of our church

members. This tanks served two purposes. First, they are to be a blessing to the family during the water cuts. Second, it allows them to share water with their neighbors as a way to show the love of Christ and open doors to share the message of Christ. Each tank displays the logo of the church as well as John 7:38 which points us to Christ as our living water. We were encouraged that all the recipients of the tanks where very grateful and excited to be able to use this as a way to reach their neighbors.





As if that were not enough, half way through the trip the team decided to help us install a wheelchair ramp in our facility. Churches (or any other institution, for that matter) rarely have accommodations for those with special needs. The ramp has already been put into use by one of our elderly members. We are grateful that we can now accommodate to those in wheelchairs.

Then, to wrap up our week, the team hosted a Mothers' Day American Cookout. The congregation was touched that this team of 5 guys would cook them an American lunch. It was also neat to see some Peruvians step up and cook alongside of them. Language barriers are no problem

when guys are grilling out! For several, it was their first time to taste hamburgers and hotdogs. The fellowship was great and we were able to clean up just before heading to the airport.
