These words written on the missionary card of our newest teammates, John and Lorena McCall, hone in a huge hole in our mission – university ministry. We have been praying for missionaries to reach the thousands of university students in this major city, and after John and Lorena came to visit Arequipa, we knew that God was answering that prayer.

The McCall’s calling into missions came after 10 years of John working at the University of Virginia directing outdoor adventure programs. John is excited to use his background and experience to serve the Lord by ministering to college students in Arequipa. Lorena has desired to do missions since she was in high school and is thrilled to serve in Peru after having grown up in Latin America. Please join us in prayer for John and Lorena and their three children as they are already deep into the support-raising trail. Support-raising from scratch is one of the most trying seasons of a missionary’s life and they could use all the support, contacts and prayers you can offer them! Theological Training

When we opened registration for our seminary, Seminario Biblico Reformado (SBR), we set up our classroom expecting 5-6 students. We expected we might have a few students sign up and then through word of mouth we might have a few more students sign up for our second semester and might eventually



reach 12 students. Today, with one week left in our first semester, we look back to our initial estimates and realize we severely underestimated your prayers and God's provision. After scrambling to get more chairs and slightly smaller tables, we were able to squeeze in 15 students and several on a waiting list! Students have expressed to us how their studies over this semester have already begun to shape them and help them to grow in their walk with Christ. Praise the Lord with us for our first semester.



Church planting

People love Friday afternoons. The stressful work week is wrapping up and people are finally able to take a load off and talk a little. The reason why *we*, as a church, love Friday afternoons is because we are out in the parks ready and



waiting for that Friday crowd. Each week, a faithful group from our mission church goes out and talks with people on those benches and witness how God uses us to speak his word into the lives of unbelievers. By God's grace, on one of our first outings several months ago, we drew a harvest of one man (we will call him "Hugo"). Hugo's vocabulary was colorful and seemed hostile, but he showed up at church! In the few weeks he has been coming he has already brought two new people who seem even more committed than himself! Please pray for us on Fridays. Not every week *seems* as profitable, and rejection can be pretty discouraging, but every once in a while, God gives us someone like Hugo and we are able to see tangible fruit that gives us great hope!
